A GENERATION IN **DESPERATE NEED OF** SHEPHERDS A message from our Principal Rev Dr Richard Gibson

One of the constants throughout Scripture is the need of God's people for faithful shepherds. When Moses was informed by the LORD that he would not enter the promised land, one of his greatest concerns was that the people would be left like sheep without a shepherd. He begged God to raise someone to fill

the void, "that the congregation of the

shepherd" (Numbers 27:17).

LORD may not be as sheep that have no

It is a fear that echoes through the Bible. The prophet Ezekiel railed against those who should have been feeding God's flock. Instead of strengthening the weak, healing the sick, binding up the injured, bringing back the strays and seeking the lost, they had exploited their positions of trust and authority. They ruled with "force and harshness," fleecing the sheep and feeding themselves (Ezekiel 34:4, 8). As a result, God's people are scattered and vulnerable to all kinds of predators.

In that same chapter, the LORD promises to come and shepherd his sheep, searching, seeking out, rescuing, gathering and bringing them into green

pastures (Ezekiel 34:11-16). And to do that, he will raise up the True Shepherd, 'my servant David' to be a prince among them (Ezekiel 34:23-24).

So. Jesus came into our world, moved with compassion for the people because they were harassed and lost, "like sheep without a shepherd" (Mark 6:34). He declared that he was the Good Shepherd, who knows the sheep by name and loved them enough to lay down Many go into leadership positions in his life for their safety and their eternal life (John 10:11, 14-15).

The apostle Peter, had watched this Good Shepherd and he knew the desperate need in his generation for leaders that would "shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain,

but eagerly; not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock" (1 Peter 5:2-3).

Our generation is no exception: we still desperately need faithful shepherds. At our recent Graduation ceremony, we celebrated the completion of the studies of our graduates. They have been shaped deeply by God's word; now they begin new chapters in their service of his world. churches and on the mission field. Please pray that they will be faithful, humble shepherds. Pray that when the chief Shepherd appears, they "will receive the unfading crown of glory" (1 Peter 5:4).

GREAT IS THY Reflections on God's faithfulness with Kylie Moody **FAITHFULNESS**

Starting her studies at BST in 2000, 19-vear-old Kylie felt challenged to pursue God's call on her life wherever that may lead.

At college, Kylie grew not only in her knowledge of the Word of God but also experienced deep stretching and growth as a person. "I was often pushed out of my comfort zone, and had to learn—sometimes the hard way—what trust and obey looked like...l became aware—as my journals attest—of how much I had yet to learn."

One of these growing times came as she taught Religious Instruction (RI) at a local primary school as part of her studies.

"During a lesson on what Jesus had done... It was as though there was a tangible hush that settled over the class. One of the students raised their hand and asked if they could become a Christian. Then another one, and another one, until it seemed the whole class asked if they could receive the Lord Jesus into their heart and life.

"I didn't quite know what to say or do! I told them to go home and think about what I had said and that I would come back next week (after I had consulted with my [BST] superior, John Lawson!). The following week... the children were absolutely iumping with excitement at being able to pray and ask Jesus into their lives. So I did. They all bowed their heads and prayed confessing their sin, asking for Jesus to forgive them—making them His own... The excitement that fell was breathtaking.

"But I was concerned as well. What would happen now? Many of these children

didn't even have a Bible! And what on earth would their parents say? The following week I was handed an envelope from a student's parent. I opened it with trepidation. I was expecting outrage. What I read blew me awav.

"The mother wrote to thank me. She said she had been struggling with her son's behaviour for so long. The past week he had changed, and the only thing she could put the transformation down to was the fact that he had prayed in Rl... The tears and joy and relief [I felt] was overwhelming. God was at work... This experience was both a challenge and an adventure of learning to trust God."

"Once again, He drew near, through His Word in such a real, practical and personal way."

After graduating from BST, Kylie completed postgraduate studies in Primary Education. She married Amos Moody, who happened to be a boarder at BST, and began serving and growing their family together. Years later, as a family of seven and relocating for the second time in two years, Kylie found herself longing again for more of God's Word.

"My hermeneutics and Old and New Testament classes were invaluable to my growth at this time. They gave me the tools to know how to deal with Scripture... Once again, He drew near, through His Word in such a real, practical and personal way... found myself saying to people that I wished every growing believer could do at least those three subjects, because they are so foundational for ongoing growth.'

From here, Kylie combined her teaching degree with her Bachelor of Ministry from BST to establish Women Thinking Biblically. "I began a regular night for women of all ages and stages... These nights were practical—workshopping God's Word for everyday Christian women. We'd eat a meal, share around the Word, and then pray... These were amazing nights."

From here. Kylie was encouraged by her husband to put some of the content from these nights into a book. And in May 2021, Kylie's book Women. Thinking. Biblically. was published by Arkhouse.

Just a few weeks ago, Kylie's path led her back to BST. "When I saw the workshop on teaching God's Word effectively at BST, 'The very words of God', I was keen."

Along with 60 other participants, Kylie explored how to teach the Word of God through the expository preaching method allowing the Word of God to speak for itself. "Three hours felt like 15 minutes! I'm preparing to speak at a Women's camp in two weeks and just soaked up the

teaching like a sponge."

"The college was the beginning of a road of trust - formative for me in so many ways. It equipped me with a tool kit to take into my life – a tool kit that is still powerfully needed...I am so aware of God's incredible faithfulness. Morning by morning new mercies I see. Great is Thy faithfulness. Lord, unto me."

"I want people to see the treasure that is the gospel. God's Word—it has shaped me, it's transformed me and it's fuelled me to share His Word."

not just a personal journey of growing in his love for God—it was the beginning of his journey into pastoral ministry.

"[God] really did a heart work in me [at BST]; he opened my eyes, opened my heart to see how the gospel changes everything—it changed my life, and [I could] see how it's changing my fellow friends' and students' lives.

The Lord showed me during that time at Bible college to step into pastoral ministry; to be a pastor... to shepherd his flock."

Jonno's opportunity to serve in pastoral ministry came after completing his BST Field Education Course at Birkdale Baptist Church. Jonno was invited by the Senior Pastor to stay on as a student intern in

2017 and he has been there ever since. Today, Jonno is the Generations Worker at Birkdale Baptist Church, and is in the process of becoming a pastor.

"I oversee the youth ministry, the young adults, we have an evening service that I oversee that as well... I'm very blessed also to be a part of the leadership team, helping with the visioning and the caring of the people that attend Birkdale Baptist Church."

As Jonno reflects on his time at BST he can see how it shaped his heart for his current ministry.

"My heart for my role here at Birkdale is similar to what I learnt at BST. I want people to see the treasure that is Jesus: the treasure of his Word is life-changing. There is an absolute joy when we discover the treasure that is him. I want people to see

that—I want when they open up the Bible that they can mine it for all the gems and all the treasures that are there... and it fills them to go out and share that good news."

Indonesia is the fourth most populous nation in the world, and the largest Muslim-majority country, with 275 million people over 17,000 islands.

BST's Centre for Asian Christianity has a vision is to be an Australian hub for the acceleration of gospel growth in the Asian Church. As such, we have been investing in spreading the gospel throughout Indonesia through a partnership with a Bible College on the island of Sulawesi-STFT Jaffray Makassar (JTS).

This Bible College is strategically located in the largest city in Eastern Indonesia and is one of its largest Bible Colleges, with more than 700 students. STFT Jaffray Makassar and BST share much in common in terms of our vision, values and ethos. We are both evangelical,

committed to the authority of Scripture, emphasise the spiritual formation of students alongside their academic study, and are passionate about faithfully fulfilling the Great Commission through training godly men and women for ministry.

In August 2022, Dr Samuel Goh and I visited STFT Jaffray Makassar. We were very grateful for the hospitality and warm reception extended by Principal Dr Panggarra, Dr Luthy, and the faculty and staff at JTS. During our visit we explored what partnership between BST and STFT Jaffray might look like. In January 2023, BST Principal Dr Richard Gibson spent a week ministering at STFT Jaffray to cement and advance our partnership.

Richard had the exciting opportunity to teach at several significant events including preaching at the Opening

Service for the entire student body, leading a Bible teaching seminar, and delivering the opening and closing addresses at Festival Misi (a three-day Mission Conference). Richard also met with Jaffray faculty members who are being supported in training by CAC, along with other Christian leaders.

During his week of ministry Rev Dr Gibson and Dr Robbie Panagarra historically signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to formalise the partnership between BST and STFT Jaffray. Please continue to pray for our ongoing ministry together and for generous supporters to help finance the partnership.
