Student accommodation on campus is a cornerstone of the experience of learning in community at BST. Living together makes for building relationships, supporting each other, sharing everyday tasks, along with the convenience of living close to the library, lecture rooms and other facilities. We aim to provide an environment conducive to effective study and personal growth.

Our Residential Chaplain supervises the accommodation, monitors the well-being of residents and encourages hospitality. Our hope is that lasting relationships of mutual support in the service of the gospel will result. We've seen that happening over many years.

Living on campus is not a refuge from the responsibilities of life, but a context in which we meet our responsibilities to each other in contributing to the community. Naturally, it is not just pleasant days and happy friendships. Residents face health challenges, difficult personal circumstances and various crises. Academic study and regular deadlines for assessments can place people under pressure. Deeper trust in Jesus, relationships and character are formed out of difficult or stressful situations, but that does not mean they are easy.

So residential accommodation is not for everyone. Residents may have to cope with personal challenges and academic deadlines at the same time. It is important to have supportive relationships outside of the college for times like that. Living away from home for the first time, or faulty expectations of the responsibilities involved, can prove very demanding.

BST's Residential Accommodation Application process is designed to help us work out together what will be the best living context to enable you to learn well and meet the academic requirements of any course. Through the process, we want to ensure the environment is a healthy one for you and those around you, as we grow more like our Lord Jesus.

Statement of Faith

Preamble

Brisbane School of Theology (BST) is a community of Christians who differ in experience, church and denominational association, ministry goals, academic ability, ethnic background and age. This diversity occurs within a context of unity because of a common allegiance to Jesus Christ, a desire by all to fulfil God's will in the church and world, and a shared commitment to the truths of the authoritative Word of God, the Bible.

Beliefs foundational to the Christian faith are taught with conviction at BST and unity is expected in relation to them. There are however, a number of issues which are secondary or peripheral, and many Christians have different views in regard to them, being matters of interpretation. The College grants faculty, staff and students the freedom to hold their own convictions in relation to such issues, in a context of unity and mutual respect.

Doctrinal Statement

The college seeks to uphold the following foundational beliefs:

[GOD]	God is the creator and sustainer of all things.
[JESUS]	Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is fully God and fully human, in one person. He lived a sinless life, died in the place of sinful human beings and experienced bodily resurrection before ascending visibly to heaven.
[THE HOLY SPIRIT]	The Holy Spirit lives within all Christians and empowers us to grow spiritually and serve God in the world.
[THE TRINITY]	There is one God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, who share together equally and eternally in the one being of God.
[THE BIBLE]	The Scriptures, consisting of the Old and New Testaments in their entirety, are the inspired and infallible written Word of God and have been given by God to the church as the final authority for what to believe and how to live.
[THE CHURCH]	The church is the people of God, made up of all who are joined to Jesus Christ through faith regardless of ethnicity, gender, socio-economic status or denominational association.
[HUMANITY]	All humans are sinners, disobedient to God, and have a broken relationship with Him until given new life by the Holy Spirit.
[SALVATION]	The only way for men and women to be in a restored relationship with God is through faith in Jesus Christ who, through his sacrificial death, has done all that is necessary for God to forgive our sins.
[RESURRECTION]	Jesus Christ will return personally at the end of the age when there will be a bodily resurrection of all people, followed by judgement leading to eternal life or eternal separation from God.
